Anaphylaxis—Life Threatening Allergies

At St. Gabriel the Archangel, we work in collaboration with the YCDSB, school, home and community in teaching our children and staff all about anaphylaxis and keeping our allergic children safe. St. Gabriel is a peanut/nut safe environment.

Complete and total avoidance of allergens is the only true way to protect and preserve the life of an anaphylactic child.

At St. Gabriel we are extremely proud of our parent community, students and staff for their dedication and commitment to ensure the safety of anaphylactic students.

Some classrooms have children with additional food allergies. Students and parents have been notified of these additional foods that also must be strictly avoided for the safety of the allergic children.

Please have a look at the display case in the foyer for food and snack alternatives.

Remember:

- not to send any peanut or nut products;
- not to send specific products to identified classrooms;
- to take the time to read **all** labels which may state "May contain traces of..." or "Manufactured in a facility that produces nut/peanut products..."
- to remind caregivers/babysitters of our allergy policies;
- to enforce the "no food sharing" policy with your children.

PAUSE TO PLAY

From April 30th to May 4th, the students of St. Gabriel the Archangel are encouraged to participate in York Region Public Health's challenge "Pause to Play". Children and youth are encouraged to put televisions, video games, computers and other electronic devices on pause for one full week. Reducing screen time (outside of school or homework) is important for promoting and maintaining healthy weights, improving concentration, and the ability to learn. The Canadian Paediatric Society recommends limiting screen time for school aged children to less than two hours per day. The pause to PLAY Challenge is a great way to remind everyone to take a break from their screens and encourage active play outside.

Tips for parents:

- Encourage children to play in natural outdoor spaces and in a variety of weather conditions
- Enforce screen time rules and socialize away from screens
- Role model by taking part in active play and using your screens less




Basketball
