## Preliminary Dress Code Survey Results

This Fall, the community of St. Gabriel the Archangel CES participated in a preliminary survey to determine whether or not to change the type of dress code (standardized) presently at St. Gabriel the Archangel. Of the total eligible number of families in the school community, **less than 30%** indicated a preference to move forward with a formal voting process. As per Policy 209A—Elementary Student Dress Code, this means that the dress code at St. Gabriel will remain as a *standardized dress code*. As per 209A policy, the next review of type of dress code will be in five years. Thank you for your participation in the preliminary survey.

### JK Registration begins on January 7, 2019 For School year 2019/ 2020

To register your child(ren) for September 2019, you must provide the following original documents/ forms for each child:

- 1. Roman Catholic Baptismal Certificate (child or parent)
- 2. Proof of Age (i.e. child's birth certificate)
- 3. Proof of Legal Status in Canada (if required)
- 4. Proof of Residency (i.e. Drivers License, tax bill or rental agreement, utility bill, etc.)
- 5. Proof of English Separate School Support (i.e. property tax bill that shows school support designation, MPAC Assessment Notice, Confirmation of school support designation or, completed and signed school support form(s), which are included in the registration package).

## SNOW

We encourage children to play in the snow, but we do have some safety rules that they must follow for their safety and well-being:

- 1. When building snow structures no roofs, no tunnels. As these pose serious risk of collapsing which can result in serious injury.
- No snow ball throwing, no kicking or throwing of snow. Injuries have occurred in the past due to the force of impact and/or ice particles in the snow causing scratches/cuts/ bruising etc.
- 3. No tripping or tackling, or pushing students into the snow on the ground or snow banks. This is also in keeping with our daily rule which is read over the P.A. every morning.

#### "At St. Gabriel we respect ourselves and others, we keep our hands and feet to ourselves. We respect others through words and actions. We work and play fairly and include others."

If students do throw **snow/snowballs** the consequences may include one or more of the following:

1st time: a letter to parents and detention(s).

2nd time: **phone call** to parents for a repeated incident, and increase in number of detention(s) and Reflection paper.

3rd time: **parent meeting** and appropriate consequences, and Reflection paper.

# **ROUGH PLAY**

**Rough play is absolutely not allowed.** Games that include physical contact: such as wrestling, tackling, tugging, kicking, punching, pushing etc., are not permitted, due to it may lead to increase aggression toward others and/or may result in serious injury.

Cooperative play is encouraged. Students are encouraged to take turns, include others, and never physically or verbally abuse anyone.

It is *never* acceptable to hit another person. Self-defense is for dangerous community/public at risk situations, where ones' personal safety is at risk. At school students must resolve conflicts by:

- 1. Using their words, in an appropriate manner
- 2. Walk away
- 3. Ask an adult to assist them

Students are reminded frequently and regularly of these rules on the announcements, by their classroom teachers, staff on duty and with reminders for safe recess play which are posted in their classrooms.

# WINTER RECESS ROUTINES

Weather permitting, students will be outside for both 15-minute recesses and the 40-minute lunch recess during the winter months.

We check the weather station before each recess and adhere to:

-15°C lunch recess is shortened to 20 minutes outdoor and 20 minutes indoor and short a.m. and/or p.m. recesses are outdoor

 $\mbox{-}16^{\circ}\mbox{C}$  and lower, it will be indoor recess for short and lunch recesses

Please ensure that your child comes to school dressed for this length of time outside. Students who play in the snow must have snow pants, boots, hats, scarves and water repellent gloves.

It's a good idea to have <u>an extra change of clothes</u>, at school especially for primary students, in the event that their socks or pants get wet. These clothes items should be clearly labelled and kept in the child's school bag so that we do not have to inconvenience you with a phone call requesting that you bring dry clothing for your child.

## **INCLEMENT WEATHER PROCEDURES**

In the event that school buses are canceled due to Inclement weather, parents/guardians are able to listen to the radio and TV stations listed below for bus cancelations. Also make note of the following:

- Please use the Safe Arrival System if your child(ren) is absent due to inclement weather.
- Please exercise discretion in deciding whether to send your child to school.
- The decision to cancel school transportation service is region-wide, meaning all school buses, vans and taxis are not operating. Schools will be open and parents/guardians can make alternate arrangements to transport their children to and from school.
- As school transportation is cancelled in the morning, it will not operate in the afternoon.
- Exams, tests, quizzes, excursions, charter trips, school programs, co-curricular activities, evening presentations, workshops, inservices, as well as, parent meetings (e.g. Identification, Placement, and Review Committee Meetings, IPRCs) are cancelled and will be rescheduled.
- Hot lunches will be canceled. If you choose to send your child to school, they must bring a lunch from home.
- Permits are cancelled for the evening.
- All Continuing Education Courses scheduled for during the day and evening, are cancelled. This includes: ESL, Secondary, and Adult Interest Courses.

# Inclement Weather Notification

School transportation service may be cancelled due to inclement weather and/or poor road conditions. Unless otherwise stated, schools remain open when transportation services are cancelled. The safety and well-being of our students is taken into consideration when making decisions concerning the cancellation of school transportation. In the event that school transportation is cancelled, parents and students should develop alternate care/ transportation arrangements. Information regarding the cancellation of school transportation or school closures is made available by 6:15 a.m.

Cancellation decisions are made after thorough consultation with the Safety Officers of school bus companies servicing York Region and are based on several factors including precipitation, air temperature, road conditions and weather forecasts. A decision to cancel school transportation service is region-wide, meaning all school buses, vans and taxis will not operate.

Cancellations are made region-wide as both the YCDSB and the YRDSB operate many regional educational programs, and students attending these programs are transported over large areas covering several municipal boundaries.

# In the event of School Transportation Cancellations:

- Unless otherwise stated, schools will remain open.
- If school transportation is cancelled in the morning, it will not operate in the afternoon.
- If school transportation is cancelled, all excursions and charter trips will also be cancelled.

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## Active School Travel

#### Dear Parent(s)/Guardian(s),

As the colder months approach us, our time spent outdoors is often limited. However, there are many benefits to being outdoors in the winter including: encouraging creative play; increasing physical exercise using different muscles groups; getting fresh air; improving problem-solving skills; and increasing exposure to vitamin D.

Just as we prepare for winter by bundling up or getting our flu shots, we prepare for Christmas by celebrating the Advent season. Advent is a time to reflect and prepare for the birth of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ.

Our York Catholic Active School Travel Team and Religious Education Department have teamed up this Advent to take our students on an Active School Travel Challenge. Using the Jesse Journey Tree, pictured on the right, students are encouraged to reflect on a different Jesse Journey Tree symbol and its related scripture passage each day as they journey to school between December 3 - 21.



#### How it works:

- <u>Download our Active School Travel Challenge Package</u> containing Jesse Journey Tree symbols, scripture passages and prayers for each day of Advent. Please print off a copy for your child. The package is also posted on the Boards website under Student Transportation at: <u>https://www.vcdsb.ca/student-transportation/</u>.
- Each day, families/students read the passage and prayer and children colour and cut out their symbol at home (with the help of an adult as needed), and carry it with them as they walk/wheel to school or their bus stop while making the daily journey connections.
- When students arrive at school, or at an appropriate time during the school day, they should then add their symbol under the Jesse Journey Tree located in the school's front foyer. Over the course of the 15 school days during Advent, the tree will fill up.
- We will Tweet the symbols and connections each school day from @ycdsb\_AST. Tweet us photos of your journey and tag @ycdsb\_AST so we can share your child's Advent journey.
- Following the daily symbols in the <u>Active School Travel Challenge Package</u> there is a picture of a
  Jesse Tree for your child to colour the corresponding symbol for each day they walk/wheel to school or
  the bus stop. Send a photo of your child's coloured tree to: <u>activeschooltravel@ycdsb.ca</u> by
  January 7, 2019 to be entered in a prize draw! The winner will be chosen by random draw, no
  minimum days required for entry.
