Dear Parents and Guardians,

Christ is risen, alleluia!

On this, the solemnity of solemnities, I want to take the opportunity to wish you and your children a very happy and blessed Easter! The Resurrection is the fulfilment of our Saviour's promise of salvation and the Easter season is a time when we take a moment to celebrate the gift of our redemption with our families. It is also a time of great celebration in our schools, that coincides with the arrival of spring and new beginnings.



Holy Week, which has led us to this glorious moment, is the most solemn and holy period in our liturgical year. It is an opportunity for us to pause and enter into the Paschal Mystery by uniting our own suffering with that of Christ. These days are a period of particular importance in our schools as our students are given the opportunity to reflect on their life of faith. Our Lord's entrance into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday signifies the beginning of our liturgical celebration of the Paschal Mystery, where we consider His coming Passion, Death, and Resurrection during the Triduum.

Holy Thursday, the first day of the Triduum, reminds us of the celebration of the Last Supper and the institution of the Eucharist, which is the source and summit of our faith. Good Friday marks Christ's sacrifice of His life as well as our humble acknowledgement that God himself paid the ultimate price for our salvation. Holy Saturday begins in sorrowful silence but culminates in our joyful celebration of Christ's victory over death in the Easter Vigil, particularly at the beautiful moment where we welcome catechumens into the Church through Baptism and share with them the redemption won for us by Christ.

This rich spiritual experience of the Paschal Mystery that we celebrate in our schools, ultimately reminds us of who we are as followers of Christ and members of Catholic school communities. It is the central moment in our life of faith, especially as we are reminded that we are sons and daughters of God through the great mystery of our redemption.

May the glory of Christ's Resurrection be a moment of joy and peace in your lives and those of your children this Easter.

### Anaphylaxis—Life Threatening Allergies

At St. Gabriel the Archangel, we work in collaboration with the YCDSB, school, home and community in teaching our children and staff all about anaphylaxis and keeping our allergic children safe. St. Gabriel is a peanut/nut safe environment.

Complete and total avoidance of allergens is the only true way to protect and preserve the life of an anaphylactic child.

At St. Gabriel we are extremely proud of our parent community, students and staff for their dedication and commitment to ensure the safety of anaphylactic students.

Some classrooms have children with additional food allergies. Students and parents have been notified of these additional foods that also must be strictly avoided for the safety of the allergic children.

Please have a look at the display case in the foyer for food and snack alternatives.

Remember:

- not to send any peanut or nut products;
- not to send specific products to identified classrooms;
- to take the time to read **all** labels which may state "May contain traces of..." or "Manufactured in a facility that produces nut/peanut products..."
- to remind caregivers/babysitters of our allergy policies;
- to enforce the "no food sharing" policy with your children.

With the new spring and change in weather, and in an effort to keep a healthy and safe school, we kindly ask that you keep children home when they are sick in order to reduce and eliminate the spread of disease. This is especially important as St. Gabriel is home to immunocompromised children. This means that their immune system is impaired and therefore not strong enough to fight off viruses and infection the way a healthy child's immune system does. Sickness cannot always be identified until after it is spread, but any effort to maintain a healthy school is appreciated.

### RELEASE OF STUDENT INFORMATION

Personal information about students is privileged and protected by law. On occasion parents will inquire about how a student at school has been disciplined in matters involving their own child. In the interest of student safety and privacy, it is inappropriate for us to discuss any child other than your own. We thank you for your understanding in this matter.

### Late Arrival/Early Leaves:

Punctuality and regular attendance are contributing factors for overall achievement. Late arrivals in the mornings and early leaves at the end of the day while at times are unavoidable, are also disruptive to student learning and cut into instructional time and should be avoided.



### **School Driveway Safety:**

This is a reminder that it is not permitted to park on the fire route in front of the school yard **at any time**. The route must be clear at all times. Double parking **at any time** creates a potentially dangerous situation for students who must cross the driveway in order to enter or exit the school building. Moreover, the route needs to be clear for buses and emergency situations. Pylons are set up along the fire route for these purposes – please do not park in between them. **Pylons also have been set up so that the side of the school driveway (where the fire route is) will be closed off to vehicles. The exit for the driveway will be closed as well.** Additionally, please do not park on the left side of the driveway during drop off or pick up times as children are crossing the driveway. Please notify any caregivers who may be dropping off or picking up your child(dren). Those with special passes must park in the parking lot. If cars enter the driveway/parking lot, please be advised that your car will remain in the loop in the parking lot until 8:55 am and 3:50 pm. Do not attempt to pass vehicles that are stopped and waiting in cue. Thank you for putting the safety of our students first!

From April 8th to April 12th, the students of St. Gabriel the Archangel are encouraged to participate in York Region Public Health's challenge "Pause to Play". Children and youth are encouraged to put televisions, video games, computers and other electronic devices on pause for one full week. . The Canadian Paediatric Society recommends limiting screen time for school aged children to less than two hours per day. The pause to PLAY Challenge is a great way to remind everyone to take a break from their screens and encourage active play outside.

## On Friday, April 26th, 2019, St. Gabriel the Archangel will go SILENT!

Did you know that:

- ◆ 57 million children around the world do not have the chance to go to school.
- ◆ 215 million children are engaged in child labour.
- ◆ 65 million girls worldwide are denied an education.



We live in a world where noise is a part of every moment of our day. When the noise actually stops, people take notice! Even Jesus went to the desert for 40 days to be silent and remove himself from the noise of daily life. It is in SILENCE that we reflect and listen to our internal voice. On Friday, April 26th, 2019, staff and students we will participate in a WE Schools campaign that encourages us to **take a vow of silence** to advocate for those who cannot speak for themselves! Each teacher will decide upon a time during that day when all the students in his/her class will be silent. The older the students, the longer the SILENT period.

In an effort to provide education for those less fortunate in our chosen community of Nicaragua, Central America, we are also launching our WE CREATE CHANGE campaign from April 10th to April 26th. We are having a **coin drive** to raise funds for education. Every \$50 we collect, will send one child to school. **Please start collecting and bringing in your change.** Luke 4:18 students will visit each classroom daily to collect donations. The large COIN JUG will be housed in the office. Any families wishing to donate \$50 to send a child to school will receive a charitable donation slip (include parent name, address and amount of donation). **If we each give a little, we can collect a whole lot! Let's make a difference in the life of a child.**

## Holy Week

The action of this week moves from the triumph of the palm procession, through the agony and death of the Lord, to his glorious resurrection from the dead. During Holy Week, the people of God take time to reflect and pray about what Jesus has done for us in his love.

### Passion Sunday

**Palms.** The blessing of palm branches and the procession remind us of Jesus' triumphant entrance into Jerusalem. We praise Christ: "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" Jesus comes to save us and the world by the Paschal Mystery. His life, death and resurrection accomplish our salvation.



**Passion Narrative.** Quickly the mood of the celebration changes: the solemn reading of the Passion. We follow Christ on the way of the cross, along the road that leads us to Calvary and to Easter. At home, we place palms in our homes to show reverence for Jesus our leader: we are his followers in suffering as in glory.



**Chrism Mass:** On Thursday (or another day before Easter) the bishop blesses the oils in the cathedral. He blesses holy Chrism for baptism, confirmation and ordination; oil for the anointing of the sick; and the oil of catechumens for those preparing for baptism. The oils are brought to each parish church and there prominently and reverently displayed. They are used in celebrating the sacraments during the year.



## Easter Triduum:

For three full days, from Holy Thursday evening to Easter Sunday night, the Church celebrates the Paschal Mystery of Jesus Christ. This is his work of saving us by his dying and rising: one great act of God's love and mercy for us. We celebrate because Jesus has brought us into his Paschal Mystery by Baptism. With him we are baptized into death to sin; with him we rise to live a new life for God.

### Holy Thursday Evening Mass

We remember the Passover feast of the Jewish people and the Last Supper of Jesus with his disciples when we celebrate the Eucharist this evening. Before he offers himself on the cross, Jesus takes bread and says, "This is my body." He takes a cup of wine and says "This is my blood of the new covenant... shed to save all. Do this in memory of me." Jesus told us to remember him by eating and drinking. Tonight especially everyone is invited to eat the bread of life and drink the cup of salvation.



**Washing of the feet.** At the Last Supper, Jesus washed his apostles' feet to give them an example of love and service. Its re-enactment is a reminder that all Christians are called to love and to serve others.



At the end of the Mass, the Eucharist for the Good Friday Communion celebration is carried reverently through the church and reserved in a place of honour. Until midnight, members of the community spend time in prayer and adoration, remembering the Lord Jesus,



## Good Friday

The meaning of this day is clearly indicated by its name in English: it is "Good" Friday, the day when God did wonderful things for us through the suffering and death of his Son. Out of his death God has brought us light and life, making it possible for us to be saved. This is indeed a good day for the world!

**Paschal Fast** On Good Friday morning we begin our two-day fast in preparation for the Easter Vigil. We eat less food than normal and cut out entertainments. We wait until the Easter vigil to wear our spring finery. These are days for prayer and meditation.

### Liturgy

Around 3:00 o'clock, the time of our Lord's death on the cross, we come together in church to remember what Jesus has done for us. In the service of the Word, we listen to the solemn proclamation of Jesus' passion according to John, then offer prayer for the world and for God's people, the Church.

We venerate the cross, and receive the Body of the Lord in Communion. In our homes we keep the Paschal Fast all day. At other times during the day, we may go to the Church for the Stations of the Cross, or have a quiet family celebration of the Way of the Cross (Stations of the Cross).



## Holy Saturday

On this day, the body of Jesus lay in the guarded tomb and the frightened disciples hid behind locked doors. In the Church, Holy Saturday is a quiet day, the great Sabbath rest. The paschal fast continues and we avoid entertainments and distractions, as on Good Friday. During the day, the catechumens (elect) make their final preparations for baptism.

## Easter

**Easter vigil:** This service is the most important celebration of the Church year. It takes place during the dark hours of the night.

**Light service.** After the blessing of the new fire, the priest lights the Easter or Paschal candle. This represents the risen Lord and is a visible reminder that Jesus is the light of the world. Nine readings from God's word lead us from creation through God's saving works to his greatest work, the resurrection of the Lord Jesus.



**Christian initiation.** Our baptism into the death and rising of the Lord Jesus is at the centre of the celebration (Rom 6.3-11). In each parish, water for Baptism is solemnly blessed. Catechumens who have prepared over a long period of time now profess their faith in Christ and are baptized, Confirmed, and nourished with their First Eucharist.



## Suggestions for Our Communities

As stated in YCDSB Policy 102, we honour the solemnity of Holy Week in many ways. These include:

**Meetings:** There are to be no meetings on Board premises, including Catholic School Council meetings, scheduled events or tournaments during the evenings of Ash Wednesday and Holy Week so that parents, pupils, school personnel and other community members are free to attend religious celebrations and obligations.



**Excursions:** There are to be no overnight excursions or trips during Holy Week unless explicit approval has been received from the Director of Education. (For example, a religious trip or pilgrimage that starts or ends during Holy Week may be granted an exemption.)



Other considerations:

- **Parish Community:** Publish Holy Week schedule of local parishes.
- **Respect the Solemnity of Holy Week:** Holy Week is a solemnity. Easter Egg hunts & Celebrations should be offered after Easter Sunday. Also, invite staff to consider not assigning homework during the Easter Weekend to support the students who spend a lot of time with Religious observance until Easter Monday.
