Driveway Safety:

As you may have noticed, we have some new signage to accompany the driveway and parking lot improvements. Please note that in addition to the stop sign at the parking lot speed bump, there is now a right turn sign which must be observed. At the speed bump in the front driveway, there is a pedestrian crossing sign. Speed bumps are also present to slow down traffic, **please drive slowly when you are on school grounds.** Always yield to walkers and students on bicycles. Please be considerate of others and please be patient.


It is important to observe all signs each time you exit the parking lot as the entrance and exit to the school are <u>ONE</u> <u>WAY ONLY</u>. It compromises the safety of students and adult pedestrians each and every time the front entrance is used as a quick exit. Moreover, the rule of not exiting the school parking lot until the buses have gone at the end of the day should continue to be observed (3:40-3:50).



Winter Weather Reminder

It is very important that students have the opportunity to play outside and to be warm while they play. Students will be outside for both 15-minute recesses and the 40-minute lunch recess during the winter, weather permitting. We check the weather station at frequent intervals throughout the day and adhere to Board Policy #221.

Temperature guidelines will be reviewed and shared during the next CSC meeting November 20th.

Please ensure that your child comes to school properly dressed with: proper headwear, gloves/mittens, scarf and winter boots. Primary students in particular and any student who likes to play in the snow should have <u>an extra change of clothes at school</u> in the event that their socks and/or pants get wet. Clothing items should be clearly labelled and kept in the child's school bag.

Anaphylaxis—Life Threatening Allergies

At St. Gabriel the Archangel, we work in collaboration with the YCDSB, school, home and community in teaching our children and staff all about anaphylaxis and keeping our allergic children safe. St. Gabriel is a peanut/nut safe environment. You will see signs to this effect clearly posted at the entrances of the school. Please review with your child our Board's Policy 209, "Protection of Anaphylactic Students", which is located in on the Board's website, www.ycdsb.ca, under Policies.

Inclement Weather Procedures

To ensure the safety of students, school bus service may be cancelled from time to time due to inclement weather, extreme temperatures and/or poor road conditions. In these cases, parents/guardians and students should develop alternate care/transportation arrangements. Cancellation decisions will be made by 6:00a.m. Cancellation decisions will only be made after thorough consultation with the Safety Officers of school bus companies servicing York Region and are based on several factors including precipitation, air temperature, road conditions and weather forecast.

You can listen to one of the radio stations listed to determine if buses for York Region have been cancelled. If the York Region District School buses are cancelled, then York Catholic District School buses are also cancelled since we share the same buses. Once cancelled in the morning, buses will *not* be running in the afternoon either. If buses are cancelled, hot lunch is cancelled as well.

Schools are rarely closed, even though buses are cancelled. *Please do not call the school to inquire if the school is open*. Radio stations will provide the necessary information beginning 7:00 a.m. Parents/guardians are asked to exercise good judgment in deciding whether to send a child to school when buses have been cancelled. If you decide to drive your children in to school, please consider that over the course of the day, weather conditions could worsen, and retrieving your child at the end of the day may be particularly hazardous.

A charming legend spread throughout Mexico telling of how a simple weed was miraculously transformed into the first poinsettia plant on Christmas Eve.
